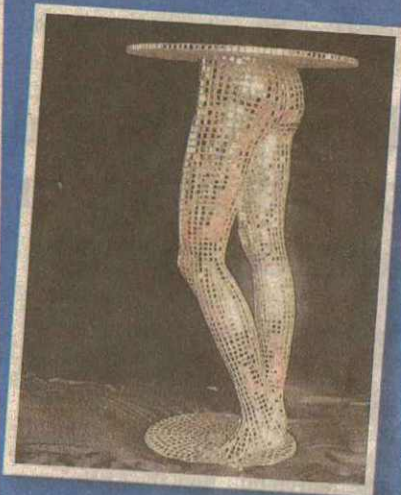

A budding artist has made a splash on a prime time TV show.

Mother-of-three Yvette Cobley's human table caused a stir on *Four Rooms*, a Channel 4 show where people who believe they have a valuable artefact get the chance to sell it to some of the country's leading dealers.

The 50-year-old's mosaic creation captured the imagination of Celia Sawyer, an interior designer with a host of celebrity clients.

The dealer snapped it up for £800 and plans to sell it on to one of her clients.

Mrs Cobley's husband Lester Cobley appeared on the show to sell the human table.

He said: "My wife has always been a creative person but it is only now that she has concentrated more on her art.

"A giraffe head she made is on sale in Cambridge art gallery Primavera and she has other items on display at March store Ambiance.

"However, Yvette doesn't just make mosaic items, she has created and sold many outdoor sculptures."

Mrs Cobley, of March, works in various styles including mixed media, ceramics and wire mesh sculpture – taking inspiration from the human form.
